

## DESIGNS OPTIONS DOOR DESIGNS

## DESIGN OPTIONS COLONIAL SHED VARIATIONS






- A There's no shortage of storage in this spacious 12-ft. by 20-ft. Colonial-style barn. It features vertical-board siding, sliding door, cupola, and cobblestone ramp.
- This 12-ft. by 16-ft. bluestained garden shed has two doublewide doors, which provide easy access to the interior. It also has three tiltin barn sash windows, a transom window, and a gable roof covered with architecturalstyle shingles.



This charming backyard building features cedar clapboards on the sidewall, board-andbatten siding on the gable end wall, and asphalt shingles on the roof. It measures 12 ft. by 14 ft., which is an ideal size for use as a storage building, garden shed, or kid's playhouse.



The rustic, natural beauty of red cedar is display in this attractive 10-ft. by 14-ft. workshow Cedar shingles cover the sidewalls; the roof made of cedar shakes. The gable wall is sided with cedar board-and-batten siding.





A Built as a tractor barn this 12-ft. by 22-ft. outbuilding features vertical-board siding, standing-seam metal roof, and doublewide doors salvaged from an old dairy barn. The upper window on the gable end wall provid access to an overhead storage loft.
